



Dr. Fang Fang obtained her Ph.D in sociology and a master’s degree in data analysis and applied statistics at Virginia Tech. Dr. Fang is an assistant professor and health service researcher at Eastern Virginia Medical School in Norfolk, Virginia. Her research focuses on older adults’ cognitive health and their risk of aging-related diseases, such as Alzheimer’s Disease and related dementia. Currently, she is involved in multiple research projects that aim to examine the effects of psychosocial factors and pharmacological treatments on cognition-related health outcomes, cognitive impairment and risks of Alzheimer’s Disease and dementia, with collaborations with researchers in EVMS and University of Pittsburgh. Her research remains on understanding cognition and related health issues from an interdisciplinary perspective and to inform decision-making at both societal and individual levels, to improve the quality of life for older adults, and she has published scholarly works in these areas.
